Vice-Presidents & Patrons needed



Summer concerts

Since our last show, the society has performed three concerts. We would like to thank all those who took part especially Jen Whittam who was persuaded to take the baton for all three – and a very good job she made of it!

First of all we performed on 20th June at Walton. For the first time, as far as we know, the society performed a mixed programme; of G&S together with items from other shows or even not from a show at all! There were a number of meetings to agree a programme that Jen felt comfortable with and, to save rehearsal time, we asked performers to volunteer a solo, duet, or trio that they were familiar with. The resulting programme was very well received by the audience. The piano was a trifle down in pitch but all the performers coped very well, helped by Norman Walker's sympathetic accompaniment. After the concert, many of us descended on Margaret Charlesworth's house for some well earned refreshment – thank you Margaret.

Next we performed a similar concert at West Bretton Church. The programme was "tweaked" a little to reflect the increased number of soloists available and to extend the time to fit the Church's request for an extended performance. Again, the feedback was extremely good and was enjoyed by both performers and audience alike. Thanks must go to Oliver Longstaff, who stepped in as accompanist in Norman's absence, travelling from North Yorkshire to help us out. We are indeed fortunate to have two such talented pianists associated with the society.

Finally, on 15th October, we performed at South Milford Women's Institute. Once again there were minor adjustments to the programme for the same reason as above, but also to try to inject a little more humour into the proceedings. However, the humour was enhanced by two of our number, (who shall remain nameless), arriving well into the opening set having travelled via a "scenic" route! Again we had a change of accompanist and this time it was Neil Aspland who tickled the ivories with very little rehearsal. Feedback to date has been equally good as for the earlier performances.

Concerts such as these rarely cover the rehearsal costs, but they do keep our members together and involved through the summer, and they usually generate a large number of ticket sales for our next show as well as enhancing our reputation in the area. Next season we will need to put together a new programme and we will try to learn from the comments those involved have made. For example, we will try to introduce more lighthearted chorus pieces. But enough of the past! It's time to focus on *The Gondoliers*! We have a high standard to live up to – you're only as good as your last performance they say. Our last performance was very very good – **let's make the Gondoliers even better!**
